The College will honor award recipients at a special Fellows in Training Forum and Luncheon on Tuesday, March 8. The Forum, presented by an outstanding faculty of ACC leaders, will address research career options in cardiology.

And, like the Scientific Session itself, it will be an excellent opportunity to meet colleagues from around the United States, and to interact with world-renowned panelists.

### Purpose

The purpose of these awards is to encourage and recognize research during cardiovascular-related subspecialty fellowship training programs. Twenty Fellow in Training members of the College will be selected by the ACCF Cardiology Training and Workforce Committee to receive Travel Awards, which include round-trip, coach air fare, hotel/lodging, and meals in conjunction with attendance at ACC '05.

### Applications

Applicants for the ACCF/Bristol-Myers Squibb Travel Awards will be nominated by their training program directors. The official application form consists of four pages and includes biographical information, nominee citations, and a one-page personal statement by the applicant on career directions and goals.

### Eligibility

1. The applicant must be from an ACGME- or AOA-approved training program in cardiology;
2. The Travel Awards generally are intended for, but not restricted to, trainees beyond their first year in a cardiovascular-related subspecialty training program;
3. There will be no more than one award to any single training program in a given year;
4. Only one applicant from the training program may apply.

Nominees may also be entrants in the Young Investigators Awards competition. However, if the nominee is named as a Young Investigators Award finalist, he or she will be ineligible to receive a Fellow in Training Travel Award. Previous Travel Award winners will not be considered.

### Judging

Criteria include major involvement in the research activities leading to presentations and publications, preferably during the period of the applicant's cardiovascular-related subspecialty training. The applicant's citations should document continued pursuit of a major research question or several interrelated topics demonstrating a continuing research activity.
