Martin B. Gold is a partner in Covington & Burlington's Washington office and is co-chair of the firm's Legislative Practice Group. Most recently, Mr. Gold served as Floor Advisor and Counsel to U.S. Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist, assisting in all aspects of floor procedure and strategy during Senator Frist's first session as Majority Leader.

He has over thirty years of legislative experience in the public and private sectors. His prior U.S. Senate experience included service as counsel to former Senate Majority Leader Howard Baker and counsel to former Senator Mark O. Hatfield. On behalf of Senator Hatfield, Mr. Gold served as Minority Staff Director and Counsel to the Senate Committee on Rules and Administration and on the staff of the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence. Thereafter, Mr. Gold was a principal and founder of Gold & Liebengood and The Legislative Strategies Group, two leading Washington lobbying firms. In his work at those firms, he focused on a wide variety of issues, including sports law, antitrust, communications, health care, and pharmaceuticals.

Mr. Gold is the author of Senate Procedure and Practice: An Introductory Manual, a widely circulated primer on U.S. Senate floor procedure. An expanded volume will be published in Spring 2004. He is also a contributor to The Book on Congress, a 1992 compendium of House and Senate procedures. Over the years, Mr. Gold has presented hundreds of seminars on Senate procedures and practices for Republican and Democratic Senate members and staffers. He has also lectured at the Russian Federal Assembly, the Parliament of Ukraine, Moscow State University, the Russian Foreign Service Institute and before numerous domestic university audiences on American political developments and the parliamentary processes of the United States Congress.

Mr. Gold earned his J.D., M.P.A., and B.A. degrees from The American University and was elected to the Cosmos Club in Washington, DC, for distinction in the field of public affairs.
