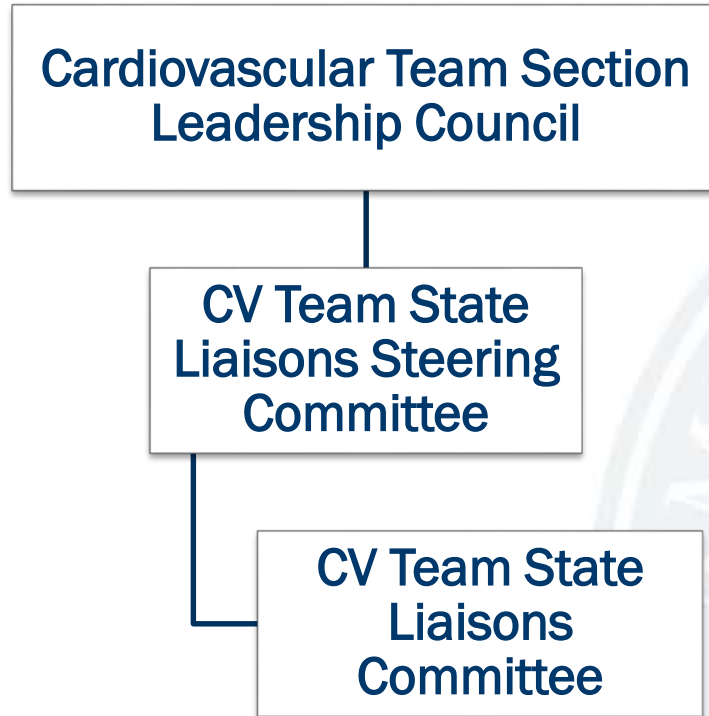

Why Restructure the Committee?

- Due to the size of the CV Team State Liaisons Committee, it has been difficult to engage the entire group on conference calls.
- To improve communication and engagement, the committee will be divided into small groups by geographical region.
- Each region will have a Regional Director who will communicate updates from ACC National and serve as a resource for the Liaisons in their region.
- A steering committee, comprised of the Regional Directors, the chair of the CV Team State Liaisons and a representative from the CV Team Section Leadership Council, will meet on a monthly basis.

New Committee Structure: Steering Committee Role

- The CV Team State Liaisons Steering Committee:
 - Serves as an advisory committee to the CV Team State Liaisons.
 - Ensures that CV Team State Liaison activities and goals align with the ACC's Strategic Plan.
 - Facilitates leadership development for the CV Team State Liaisons and helps them develop a leadership pipeline through local member engagement.
 - Assists Liaisons with developing strategies to support the promotion of membership growth and retention.
 - Promotes professional and shared collaboration between CV Team State Liaisons, Chapter Executives, Chapter Governors and the State Board.
 - Provides guidance, as needed, on the annual CV Team State Liaison election process.

New Committee Structure: Role of the State Liaisons

- The role of the CV Team State Liaisons **remains unchanged**.
- CV Team State Liaisons will serve as members of their Chapter's Leadership Triad (with the Governor and Chapter Executive) and:
 - Serve as leaders for non-physician members locally and encourage teamship in all chapter activities.
 - Promote membership and engagement to CV Team professionals within their state.
 - Advocate for CV Team-specific benefits at the Chapter level.
 - Stay abreast of state advocacy concerns that may impact the practice of CV Team members in their state.
 - Stay in regular (at least quarterly) contact with the CV Team members within their state
 - Attend regional and national ACC meetings to stay abreast of College activities and opportunities



Meetings for the CV Team

State Liaisons

- Instead of monthly conference calls, the CV Team State Liaisons Committee will meet in-person once a year during the ACC Scientific Session (in March/April).
- Newly elected Liaisons will meet during the ACC Leadership Forum (usually in January).
- All Liaisons are strongly encouraged to attend the ACC Legislative Conference (in September/October); however, no formal meeting is planned at this time.
