- 1. Know the characteristic features and natural history of congenital bicuspid aortic valve disease in adult patients.
- 2. Know the etiology, natural history, pathophysiology, and differential diagnosis of acquired aortic, mitral, pulmonic, and tricuspid valve diseases.
- 3. Know the cardinal symptoms and physical findings of aortic stenosis & mitral stenosis, and their role in management decisions
- 4. Know the characteristic features and natural history of rheumatic VHD.
- 5. Know the appropriate indications for, and characteristic findings of, echocardiographic testing for diagnosis and assessment of severity during initial evaluation and upon follow-up.
- 6. Know the role of stress testing in assessment of VHD.
- 7. Know the indications for, and clinical pharmacology of, drugs used for the treatment of native and prosthetic VHD, including anticoagulation and antibiotic prophylaxis.
- 8. Know the indications and expected outcomes for surgical therapy in VHD, including valve selection and repair versus replacement.
- 9. Know the indications and expected outcomes for transcatheter therapy in VHD.
