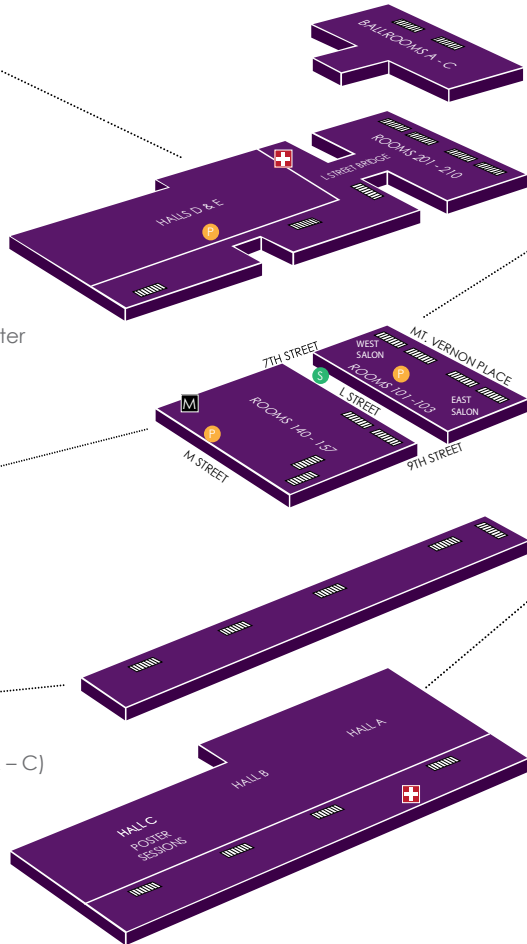

HEALTH & SAFETY REMINDERS

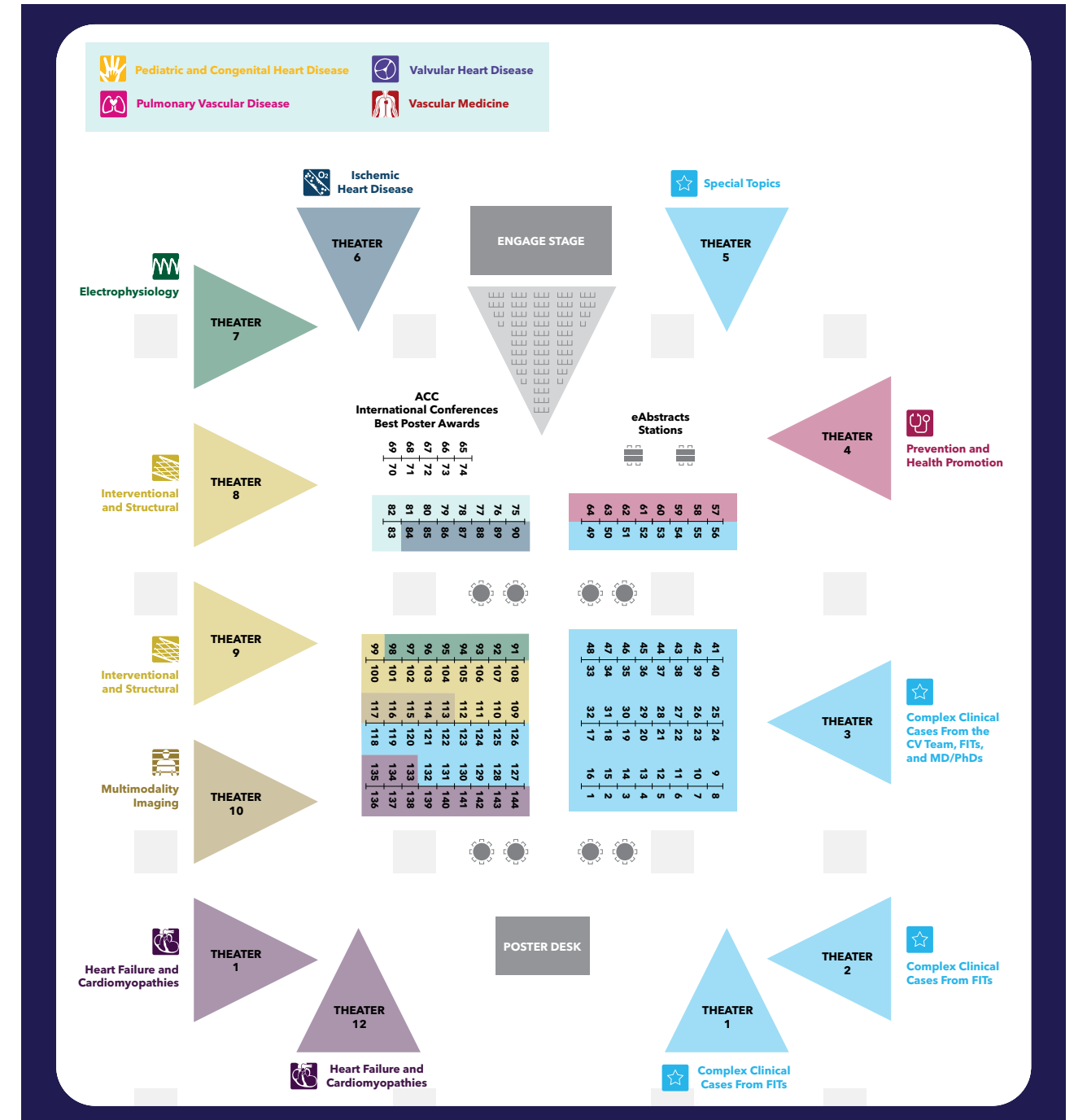

Put knowledge into action in the Personalized Skills & Simulation Center with a variety of immersive, hands-on learning opportunities where you can choose to practice both procedural as well as decision-making skills in self-directed and self-paced environment.

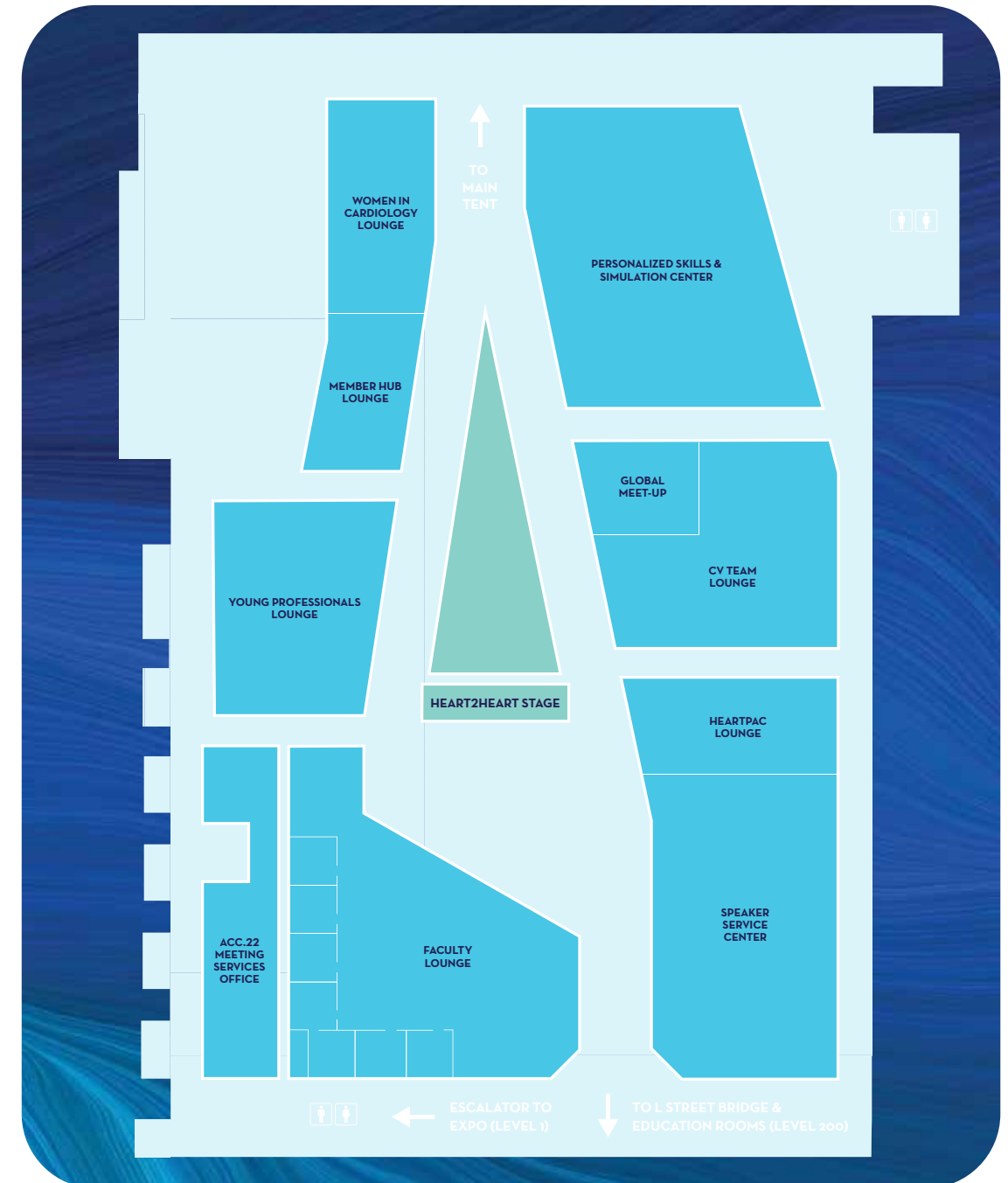

The Center includes:

- **Heart Songs:** Focus on physical exam skills including auscultation with Bluetooth stethoscopes and Point-of-Care echo device and try out both these devices on live models. With a choice of 3 modules – common, advanced, or expert murmurs – view hi-definition videos of phonocardiograms and color Doppler echo images while listening to a variety of heart murmurs.
- **Immersive Learning Bar:** Customize your immersive learning experience not only across CV disease states but also across different online learning formats. Whether you have 15 minutes or a couple of hours, you can fuel your knowledge through case-based learning, podcasts, lectures, or even games.

- **Learn by Doing:** Guided by expert faculty, choose from six simulation experiences that include cardiac-obstetrics or syncope evaluation and management (standardized patients including real-time echocardiography), loop recorder or transvenous pacing procedural stations, and a TAVR interventional simulator. You can also hone your communication skills as you provide counseling and shared decision-making discussions at several stations.
- **Practical Approaches to Pregnancy and Heart Disease Management:** A unique blended learning experience facilitated by Anne Marie Valente, MD, FACC and Kathy Economy, MD. The session includes a brief lecture followed by an opportunity for hands-on learning in the Personalized Skills Center where participants can immerse themselves in two cardiac-obstetric patient cases using a standardized patient.
- **The Red Flag Work-up: Syncope Guidelines in Action:** The assessment and management of syncope requires a nuanced approach for older adults, pediatric patients, and athletes. Using a standardized patient, this session will demonstrate how to perform the "red-flag" work-up as well as the subsequent patient counseling that should occur.

Plus, take a break and live stream sessions, access ePoster, or watch tutorials on presentation skills and test skills and knowledge essential for program directors. For additional detailed session schedule information, search the ACC.22 and filter for "Hands-on Skills Learning".
