

## Merritt Hawkins 2017 Survey of Final Year Medical Residents

- 22,000 final-year medical residents surveyed
- 81% of all final year residents (27,000 total)
- 935 responded (5%)
- 3.22% margin of error

## How Many Job Solicitations?

Includes phone calls, letters, emails

 70% received <u>51 or more</u> job solicitations (76% for primary care)


 50% received 100 or more (55% for primary care)




 73% start at least one year before completion
