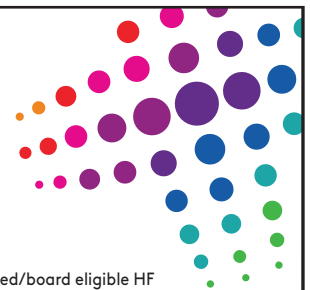
The Heart Failure (HF) Section in the Division of Cardiology at The MetroHealth Medical Center (MHMC) is seeking a board-certified/board eligible HF Cardiologist to join a growing team of HF providers at the HF Care Center. This is an academic position with an academic faculty appointment at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU) School of Medicine. In addition to clinical efforts, candidates will have protected time for teaching and research. The HF Care Center (HFCC) at MHMC is run by a collaborative team of providers including HF-trained cardiologists, HF-trained nurse practitioners, HF nurses, and a clinical pharmacist. This team provides inpatient, outpatient, and telemedicine care for a diverse population of patients with HF, various cardiomyopathies, and pulmonary hypertension (PAH) in the MetroHealth System. Several clinical programs have been established to meet the needs of our patients, including state-of-the-art PAH program, invasive and non-invasive exercise hemodynamics, remote HF telemonitoring (Cardiomems), GDMT titration clinic, and cardio-oncology program. HFCC is in the process of receiving HF Disease Specific Certification through the Joint Commission (TJC). HFCC has been the recipient of multiple get-with-the-guidelines (GWTG) Gold-plus certifications for implementing guideline-directed medical therapy for patients with HF.

The team at HFCC is especially interested in candidates with special niche and expertise in managing certain cardiomyopathies such as inherited, infiltrative, and inflammatory cardiomyopathy. Candidates will have the opportunity to establish new clinical programs focusing on their areas of interest or join in helping grow existing programs such as the PAH and the Cardio-oncology program. Candidates are also expected to manage patients with ventricular assist devices as part of the shared-care program that is expected to start soon in collaboration with the nearby transplant centers. In addition to clinical opportunities, candidates will also have opportunities to participate in several ongoing multicenter randomized clinical trials, initiate their own new clinical research, and participate in teaching activities for our cardiology fellows and other graduate training programs at MHMC.

The MetroHealth System is redesigning its campus with an innovative transformation plan to exceed the ever-changing needs of patients and programs for the community. This billion-dollar transformation is the largest public construction project in Cuyahoga County and one of the largest in the nation. In November 2022, the MetroHealth community moved into the new hospital, featuring 270 private rooms and new state-of-the-art facilities to support our patients and staff. In January 2023, the new Labor and Delivery and NICU will open. MetroHealth is also a national leader in population health initiatives and improving the social determinants of community health. We invite you to be our partner in this important journey as we strive to transform health care in Northeast Ohio.

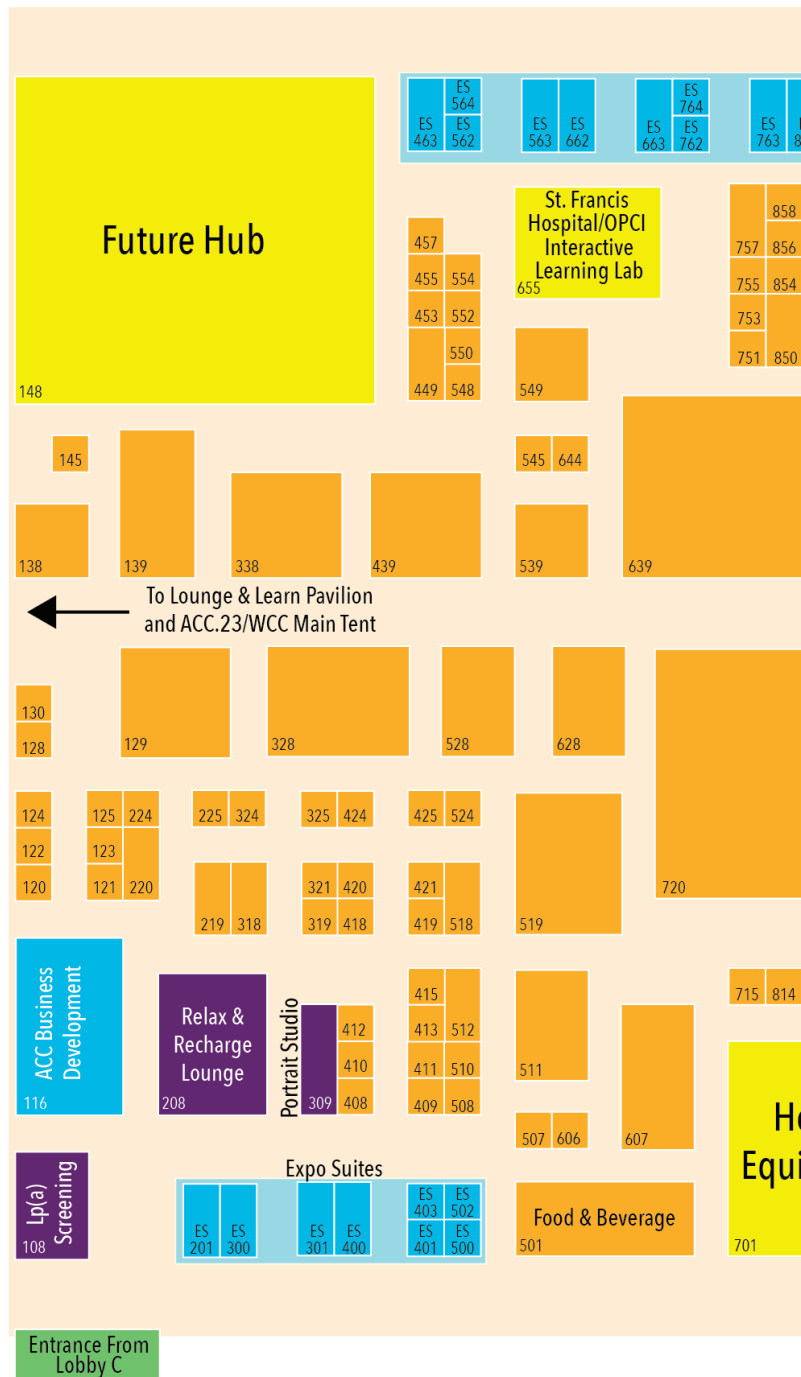

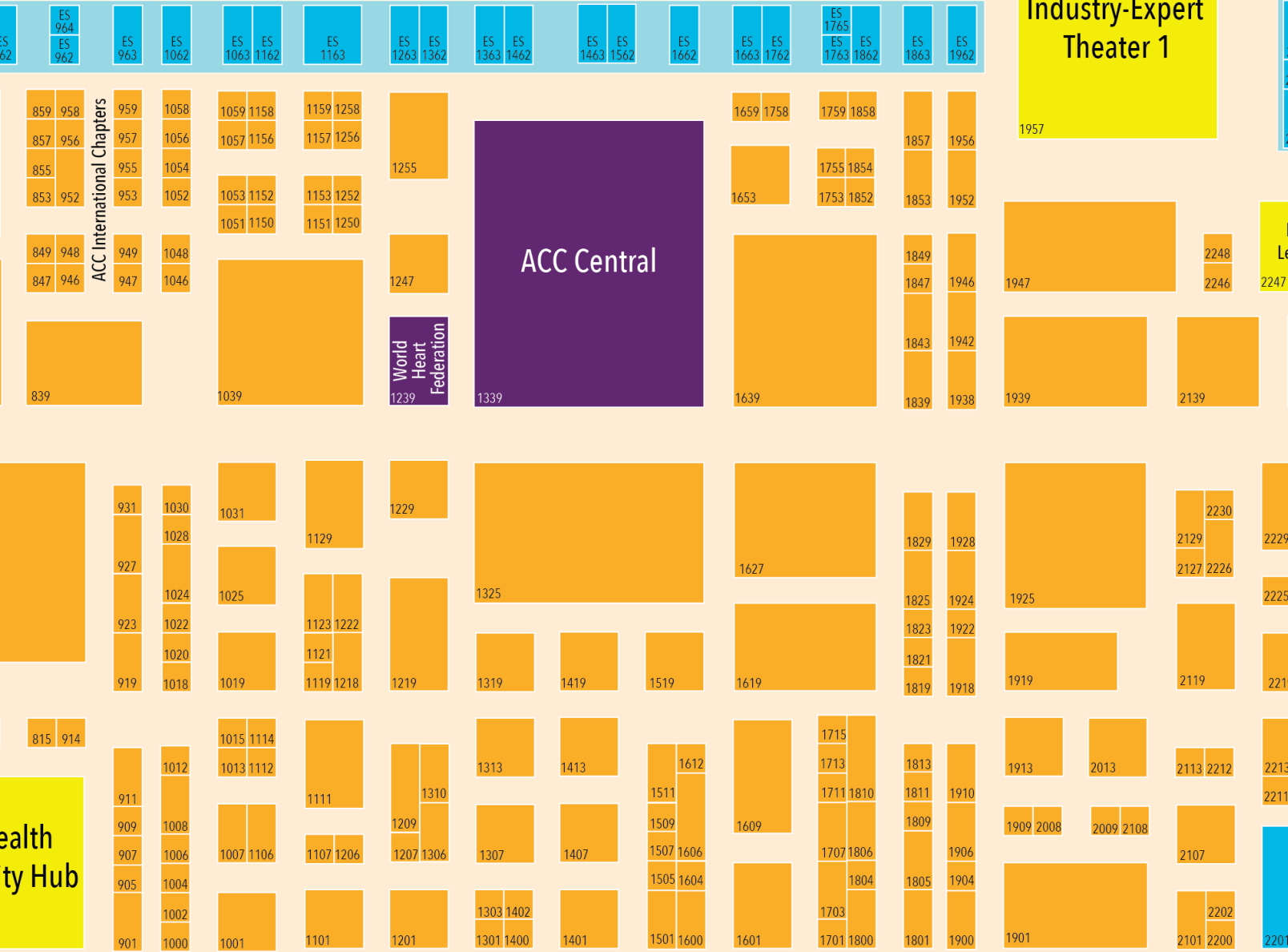

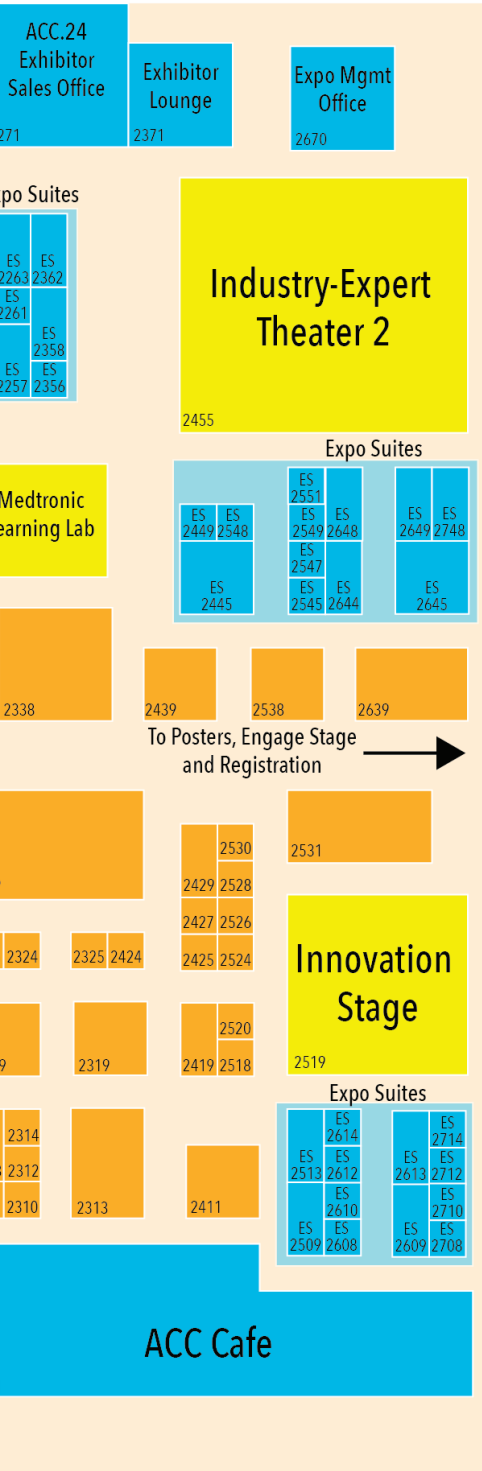
