TOGETHER TOWARD TOMORROW: Advancing Cardiovascular Care Through Community, Innovation and Impact

Looking back, 2025 was truly a year defined by growth and innovation, shaped by the strength of our community and our shared purpose of creating a world where science, knowledge and innovation optimize patient care and outcomes.

At the heart of the College's success is our membership. Insights from listening sessions throughout the year and conversations with institutional leaders reaffirmed what our members value most: meaningful networking, strong advocacy, personal connections, and opportunities for career and leadership development. These conversations also highlighted the challenges clinicians continue to face – workforce pressures, financial constraints, limited research funding and evolving training requirements. Addressing these realities requires a shared commitment to supporting cardiovascular professionals where they need it most, and we are proud of the ways the College rose to meet that responsibility in 2025.

Membership growth remained strong throughout the year. We welcomed nearly 1,500 new FACCs and AACCs to our growing family of more than 60,000 cardiovascular clinicians from around the world. Our leadership and professional development programs continued to expand, fueled by extraordinary philanthropic support from our members. This generosity enabled us to increase research and fellowship awards, broaden leadership training and observerships in the U.S and abroad, and strengthen pathways for future clinicians through our internal medicine, young scholar, and Member Section programs. Notably, we saw an 87% increase in members contributing to the ACC Foundation – an inspiring testament to our core values of patient-centeredness; teamwork and collaboration; and professionalism, excellence and equity.

Education also advanced significantly in 2025. The ACC is redefining what it means to learn in a rapidly evolving scientific and clinical environment. We are moving beyond traditional content delivery toward personalized, adaptive learning experiences that integrate human expertise with digital intelligence. The creation of the Fuster Prevention Program, the expansion of the Emerging Faculty Program and an exceptional ACC.25 in Chicago all reflect this evolution. By modernizing live education to emphasize mastery and clinical judgment, and by expanding artificial intelligence (AI)-enabled online learning and flexible, on-demand offerings, we continue to deliver high-value education that supports lifelong professional growth for cardiovascular professionals.

Innovation and digital transformation were equally prominent throughout the year. As AI moves from concept and early experimentation into daily clinical reality, the ACC is leading the way. The AI Resource Center, ACC/MedAxiom Care Transformation tools, a dedicated innovation podcast series, and resources like our integration tool to help clinicians leverage Apple Watch data in clinical interactions, all exemplify our commitment to delivering actionable knowledge at the point of care. Our new partnership with OpenEvidence, combined with digital health policy advocacy and the work of JACC Journals and the Health Care Innovation Member Section, also positions the College at the forefront of shaping the future of cardiovascular care.

Advocacy in 2025 was both vigorous and impactful. ACC advanced major priorities – including Medicare payment reform and increased funding for the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and mobilized more than 400 clinicians on Capitol Hill. We secured bipartisan support for prior authorization reform, made progress on state-level noncompete laws and AED access, and helped expand payer coverage for innovative therapies. Our efforts also strengthened maternal health legislation and supported specialists navigating new value-based care models. On the clinical guidance front, we released three new Clinical Guidelines

with the AHA, seven Concise Clinical Guidance reports, eight Scientific Statements and five additional documents, ranging from new Expert Consensus Decision documents to the much-anticipated Advanced Training Statement for advanced imaging.

These achievements reflect meaningful progress toward our Strategic Plan: increasing relevance as the professional home for cardiovascular clinicians; generating and delivering actionable knowledge; advancing quality, equity, and value in care; and sustaining the College through strong fiscal stewardship. With the 2026 budget approved and a solid financial foundation in place, we are well-positioned for the year ahead.

Thank you for your dedication, your expertise and your partnership. Together, we continue to shape the future of cardiovascular care.

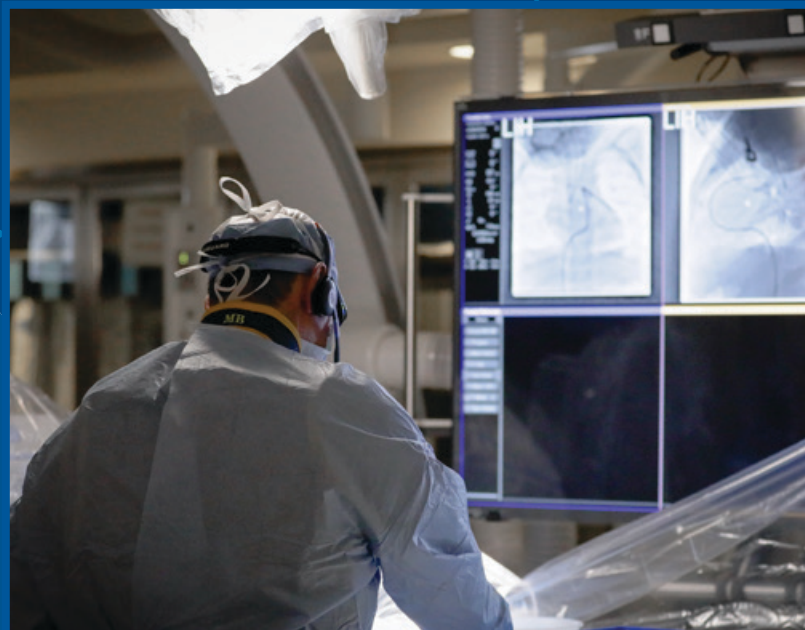

ACC's advocacy efforts in 2025 focused on advancing solutions that enhance the access, quality and value of cardiovascular care and promote heart health nationwide. Thanks to the collective efforts of members, the ACC achieved significant policy wins and made meaningful progress on key issues. Explore the top 10 highlights from this on the pages that follow.



1 FIGHTING FOR MEDICARE PAYMENT REFORM

In 2025, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services introduced several structural changes and reductions in the Medicare Physicians Fee Schedule that will negatively impact the financial viability of practices and access to high-quality patient care. The College continues to advocate for legislative solutions to add an annual inflationary update to Medicare payments and increase the budget neutrality threshold, creating a more stable system for clinicians and patients.

2 FUNDING FOR CV AWARENESS AND SCIENCE

ACC President **Christopher M. Kramer, MD, FACC**, testified before the U.S. House Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies, urging Congress to authorize funding for the previously passed **Cardiomyopathy Health Education, Awareness, Research and Training in Schools Act**. The ACC also emphasized the importance of funding for the National Institutes of Health and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

3 400+ CV CLINICIANS ON CAPITOL HILL

More than 400 clinicians convened to advocate for their patients and practice on Capitol Hill during ACC's Legislative Conference, including 100+ medical students, residents, fellows and early career members and 50 cardiovascular team members. Members participated in nearly **300 meetings** with lawmakers, garnering support for several ACC priority bills.

4 HEARTPAC: SUPPORTING CV CHAMPIONS

ACC Advocacy participated in **200+ events with lawmakers in 2025** through HeartPAC, ensuring emerging candidates are informed on topics of importance to the CV community.



5 ADVOCACY IN THE STATES

ACC State Chapters held **11 lobby days in 2025**, pushing for reforms to noncompete laws, expanding access to AEDs and more.



6 ACC MEMBERS IN ACTION

ACC members sent **thousands of messages through the College's Action Alert system**, urging lawmakers to act on key issues and explaining the impact health policies can have on both patients and clinicians.

7 SUPPORTING SPECIALISTS IN MANDATORY MODELS

Value-based care in cardiology made progress this year with the introduction of the **Ambulatory Specialty Model for Heart Failure** and the Transforming Episode Accountability Model for CABG.

8 EXPANDING PAYER COVERAGE

The ACC helped **expand payer coverage through payer statements** on appropriate indications for AI-based quantitative coronary topography/coronary plaque analysis, renal denervation, drug-coated balloons and more.



9 IMPROVING MATERNAL HEALTH OUTCOMES

Maternal health was a key topic in 2025, with **several bills to improve maternal health introduced in Congress** aimed at providing coverage for remote monitoring devices, creating/establishing state-based maternal mortality review committees, and expanding maternal mortality review committees and expanding grand programs providing emergency obstetric care in rural areas.

10 CHAMPIONING TIMELY ACCESS TO CARE

After advocating for the ***Improving Seniors' Timely Access to Care Act*** at Legislative Conference, the bill to reform prior authorization processes secured majority bipartisan support in both chambers of Congress.

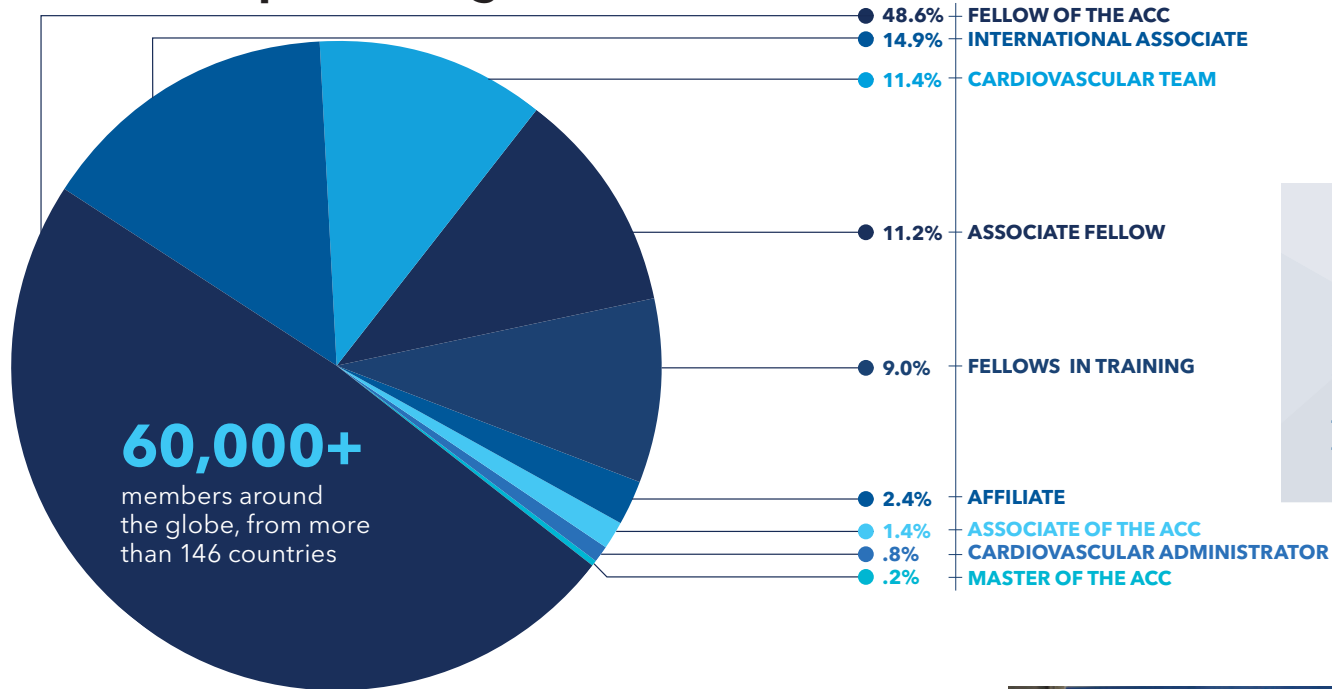

TAKING CONVOCATION ON THE ROAD

The College formally honored and welcomed new FACCs from across Asia, Latin America and the Middle East during the first-ever Convocation ceremonies outside the U.S., held in conjunction with ACC's International Conferences in those regions. **More than 90 new FACCs walked the stage to receive their stole and certificate in 2025!**



CONNECTING WOMEN IN CARDIOLOGY: ACC CHAPTER ENGAGEMENT GRANTS

Now in its fourth year, the Women in Cardiology (WIC) Member Engagement Grant program continues to serve as a catalyst for innovation, leadership development and community-building across ACC Chapters, thanks to a generous contribution from **Toniya Singh, MBBS, FACC**. Through leadership forums, mentorship opportunities and community-building events, these grants enable Chapters to create spaces where women cardiologists can connect, lead and grow. To date **more than 400 women have participated** in the program, strengthening professional networks and deepening engagement across the ACC community.

SUPPORTING MID-CAREER PROFESSIONALS

ACC took new steps to support mid-career professionals in 2025 by launching a professional development program designed to help build resilience, foster connections with peers and re-energize careers. Delivered over seven months, the inaugural cohort of 11 individuals in the new **Cardio Renew** program have access to interactive learning modules, optional one-on-one virtual coaching and an in-person networking experience at ACC.26 in New Orleans.



The ACC opens the door to a dynamic community that not only advocates for excellence in patient care, but also empowers us to advance our practice and the business aspects of medicine.

ACCELERATING DIGITAL INNOVATION AND AI-ENABLED CARE

The ACC continued expanding tools and resources to help clinicians adapt to a changing world and adopt AI into their practice. In addition to the AI Resource Center, which offers access to practical guidance on emerging technologies, ACC also partnered with MedAxiom to develop a Care Transformation Framework made up of workbooks and tools to optimize care delivery. A podcast series highlighting how new ideas are being applied across cardiovascular care, along with a tool to help clinicians leverage Apple Watch data in clinical practice, are among the other efforts led by the ACC to shape the future of cardiovascular care.

PARTNERING WITH OPENEVIDENCE

A new partnership with OpenEvidence, providing members with access to powerful, AI-driven and evidence-based tools at the point of care, debuted in 2025.

The new partnership aims to accelerate the translation of cardiovascular clinical guidance and research into clinical implementation at the point of care. By combining ACC's leadership in cardiovascular science and education with OpenEvidence's advanced generative AI technology, clinicians will have access to the latest relevant and actionable medical evidence to support shared decision-making with their patients.

SECTION ACTION SPOTLIGHTS:

The Critical Care Section: **Supporting Future Leaders in Critical Care**

The ACC Critical Care Cardiology Member Section helped launch the new **ACC Critical Care Cardiology PULSE Fellowship Program**, providing grant funding to Fellows in Training to support away electives during the academic year and expand hands-on experience in high-acuity CICU settings. Sponsored by J&J Med Tech - Abiomed, the program reflects ACC's commitment to investing in the next generation of critical care leaders. **In its inaugural year, four FITs were selected for funding.**

The Reproductive Health & Cardio-OB Section: **Advancing Maternal Health Through Advocacy**

Through a virtual Hill visit with representatives from **11 congressional offices**, the ACC Reproductive Health and Cardio-Obstetrics Member Section served as a catalyst for advancing maternal health priorities in 2025. Section leaders urged lawmakers to support bipartisan legislation that expands access to remote monitoring, strengthens systems of care, and addresses gaps in rural and underserved communities. The Section also launched a new **Postpartum Hypertension Clinic Development Toolkit** to support the development of care programs for those with a recent hypertensive disorder of pregnancy.

Advancing Prior Authorization Reform For Congenital Heart Care

The Advocacy Work Group of the ACC's Adult Congenital and Pediatric Cardiology (ACPC) Section continued to lead targeted efforts to reduce prior authorization barriers that delay care for patients with congenital heart disease. The Work Group documented system-wide challenges, proposed practical solutions, and engaged directly with a major prior authorization vendor to address concerns specific to congenital heart patients.

BUILDING GLOBAL CONNECTIONS

In collaboration with its growing network of International Chapters and the Assembly of International Governors, the College continues to forge partnerships and advance programs aimed at solving care challenges, advancing quality and transforming cardiovascular care in communities worldwide.

The ACC Virginia Chapter and the British Cardiovascular Society partnered on the Emerging Leaders Programme (ELP), designed to strengthen leadership pipelines and foster mutual learning between health systems.



The ACC Florida Chapter sent a delegation to Spain in June as part of its ongoing preceptorship with the Sociedad Espanola de Cardiologia. The program features a combination of behind-the-scenes clinical experiences at Spanish hospitals, as well as times for networking and mentoring with Chapter leaders.



ACC and JACC hosted two side events in New York in September 2025 tied to the Fourth High-Level United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) meeting. The events explored the critical link between workforce capacity and NCD care, as well as new data from the latest JACC Global Burden of Disease report, respectively.



Prince Sultan Cardiac Center Qassim, Saud Al Babtain Cardiac Center & Madinah Cardiac Center were recognized for earning ACC International Center of Excellence Awards, showcasing their commitment to providing quality cardiovascular patient care.



ACC welcomed four new chapters in 2025, in Nepal, Sri Lanka, Tanzania and Vietnam, further strengthening global collaboration and connections.

ACC's International Conferences in Singapore, Saudi Arabia and Mexico brought together **more than 2,800** clinicians and expert leaders in the field to share knowledge and best practices, make connections, and build their professional networks.



As ACC continues to amplify its global presence, these regional gatherings serve as powerful reminders that care transformation is not one-size-fits-all. Instead, it is built on partnerships, cultural understanding and a shared dedication to improving heart health - region by region, patient by patient.

INNOVATING LIFELONG LEARNING

The ACC continues to provide cutting-edge, innovative education that empowers cardiovascular clinicians with the latest knowledge and skills needed to optimize patient care and outcomes, while supporting their professional growth.

THE FUTURE OF CERTIFICATION

Despite strong support from the cardiology community and leading societies, the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) denied the application by the ACC and the broader House of Cardiology last February to create the American Board of Cardiovascular Medicine (ABCVM). The ABCVM Board of Directors is continuing to evaluate potential partnerships with organizations, but differences in scale, resources, recognition and philosophy limit these options. In the meantime, the ACC continues to advocate for a fresh approach to demonstrating continued clinical competency.

"Cardiovascular physicians should continue to maintain active certification through currently approved ABIM pathways, including continued participation in the Collaborative Maintenance Pathway. Maintaining certification ensures professional standing today while preserving flexibility as future certification models evolve," said ACC President **Christopher Kramer, MD, FACC**. "At the same time our profession has evolved well beyond the boundaries of internal medicine and the ACC remains committed to pursuing a competency framework that reflects the complexity and realities of cardiovascular care - we owe it to our patients and to ourselves."

ADVANCING SUBSPECIALTY EDUCATION

The ACC's live educational courses support learning across the spectrum of cardiovascular subspecialties, working closely with ACC's Member Section communities and providing networking and collaboration opportunities.

Experts in sports cardiology gathered at ACC's Heart House headquarters in Washington, DC, for **Care of the Athletic Heart**. The meeting provided unique opportunities to learn best practices for caring for athletes and exercising individuals and featured a special guest appearance by Philadelphia 76ers Guard, Jared Butler, who has managed a successful career while living with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.



More than 100 attendees gathered for the **Advancing the Cardiovascular Care of the Oncology Patient** at Heart House. Sessions focused on cardiovascular health in long-term cancer survivors, the use of AI in precision imaging, the future of training and clinical practice for cardio-oncologists, and more.

With cardiovascular disease now the leading cause of maternal mortality in the U.S. the ACC addressed this urgent challenge by hosting the **Cardio-Obstetrics Essentials: Team-Based Management of Cardiovascular Disease and Pregnancy** live course, bringing together nearly 100 attendees for an interprofessional deep dive into the evolving field.

INTRODUCING ACHD SAP

The ACC launched a new addition to its suite of self-assessment programs (SAPs) designed to support clinicians specializing in Adult Congenital Heart Disease (ACHD) offering:

- 74 expert-led video presentations
- 74 in-depth study guides
- 135 case-based questions
- 30 CME credits and Maintenance of Certification points

UNITING TO IMPROVE QUALITY

The ACC has a long history of serving as a trusted convener, uniting clinicians, scientists and researchers to translate the latest insights into meaningful improvements in cardiovascular care. In 2025, ACC advanced this work through the development of new clinical guidance, tools and programs that help institutions implement quality improvement initiatives, better understand patient outcomes, and equip hospitals and health systems with the insights needed to deliver quality care.



2025 QUALITY SUMMIT

Professionals across the cardiovascular team convened in Denver, CO, for ACC's Quality Summit to gain professional and clinical insights, deep dive into ACC's suite of NCDR registries and Accreditation services, and share best practices for driving meaningful improvements in patient care. 2025 QUALITY SUMMIT ATTENDEE

NEW HCM DIGITAL REGISTRY

The ACC established a digital hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM) registry to broaden understanding of HCM symptoms and improve awareness, diagnosis and treatments. The CONNECT-HCM Registry aims to provide more equitable access to treatment and care for one of the most common genetic CV diseases. To date, this registry has enrolled over 70 people with HCM.

NEW PROFESSIONAL DASHBOARDS

NCDR debuted several new dashboards in 2025. The new Population Analytics Dashboard for the Chest Pain - MI and CathPCI registries offer advanced insights, including flexible data ranges, population-based metrics, comparator cohorts, trend analysis and on/off hours performance.

Professional Level Dashboards for participants in the STS/ACC TVT Registry the LAAO Registry also became available. Users can now compare individual provider performance against national and institutional peers to identify opportunities to drive quality improvement and advance patient care using real-time, data-driven insights.

REVAMPING OUR WEB PRESENCE

The ACC revamped its **CVQuality.ACC.org** website to enhance navigation and usability, including new menu topics. Under “Education & Meetings,” access information on ACC Quality Summit and the QII Learning Center. “Quality Solutions” houses all the content previously located under campaigns and toolkits, as well as quick links to JACC Journals, guidelines, mobile apps, Early Heart Attack Care education and more.

COLLABORATING TO IMPROVE RENAL DENERVATION DATA

In 2025, the ACC collaborated with the Richard A. and Susan F. Smith Center for Outcomes Research at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center on a renal denervation (RDN) module, leveraging the ACC's CathPCI Registry. The collaboration aims to ensure the most vulnerable patients receive optimal, guideline-directed care to reduce uncontrolled high blood pressure, and will help clinicians track and analyze how RDN therapy in real-world patients.

ACC's Industry Advisory Forums bring together industry, clinical and policy leaders to discuss solutions to challenges facing the cardiovascular care landscape. The most recent meeting in December 2025 explored how rapidly evolving information ecosystems are reshaping cardiovascular care and discussed opportunities to rebuild patient trust in science.

NEW CLINICAL GUIDANCE

As part of the ACC's ongoing efforts to increase the delivery of timely, clinically relevant guidance to help clinicians navigate a rapidly evolving cardiovascular landscape, the College released a record number of clinical guidance in 2025.

3 Clinical Practice Guidelines released in partnership with the American Heart Association, addressing acute coronary syndromes, high blood pressure and adult congenital heart disease.

1 The new multi-society *Advanced Training Statement on Advanced Cardiovascular Imaging* addresses the core competencies and training requirements necessary for advanced cardiovascular imagers across all four imaging modalities.

Throughout 2025, the ACC worked to pave the road to health equity through advocacy, education and science, and developed programs and initiatives focused on shaping a future where every patient, everywhere has access to the high-quality care they need to live longer, healthier lives.

HOSTING THE CHICAGO COMMUNITY HEALTH FAIR

ACC gave back to its ACC.25 host city through its Chicago Community Health Fair in the week leading up to the meeting. ACC leaders, cardiovascular experts and more than 20 local organizations and health care providers gathered to provide important education and screenings around cardiovascular disease and risk factors such as hypertension, diabetes and high cholesterol.

HIGHLIGHTING BOLD SOLUTIONS FOR IMPROVING HEART HEALTH

The ACC's Health Equity Summit in June brought together cardiovascular leaders, industry partners and key stakeholders for important conversations focused on building and sustaining adaptive, resilient health systems. Participants looked at real-world care delivery solutions that leverage both community involvement and clinical engagement and discussed the important need for advocacy in support of policies and programs that support patient access to care.

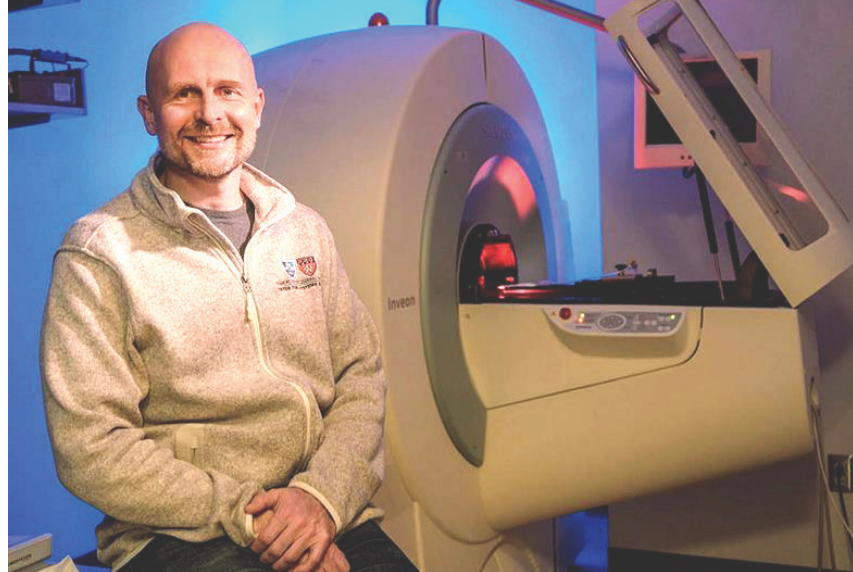

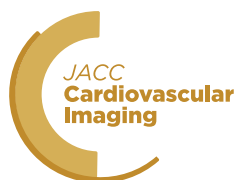


GROWING INFLUENCE: JACC IMPACT FACTOR

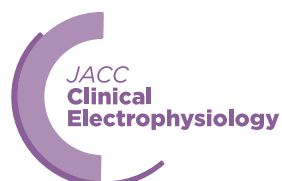

Impact Factor remains the most widely recognized metric for assessing peer-reviewed journal quality and reach, and reflects how frequently a journal's articles are cited on average, offering a comparative view of influence within specific fields.

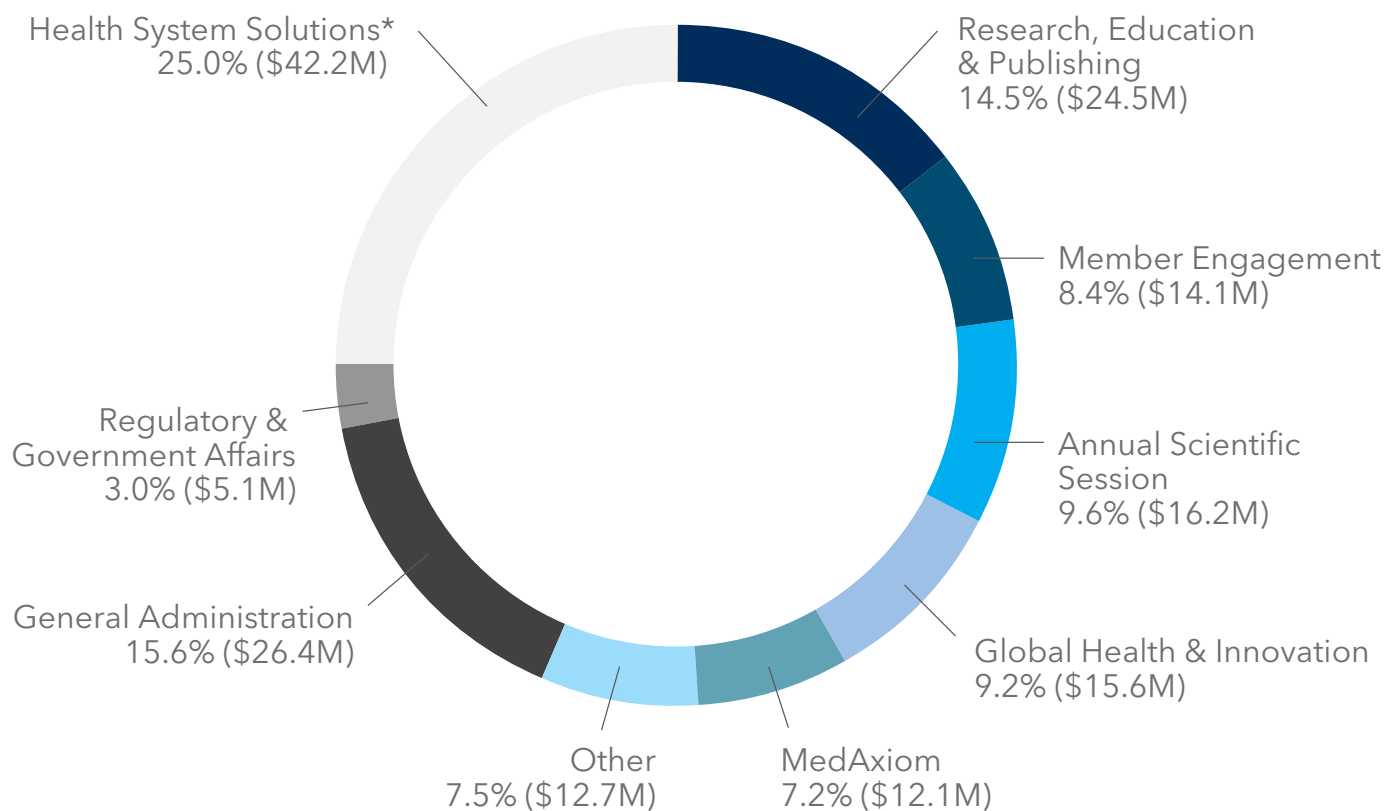
TOTAL CONSOLIDATED REVENUES - \$169.7M
