Congressional Affairs Key Activities

- Shape congressional activity through ongoing contact with members of Congress and their staff
- Review relevant legislation and solicit feedback and guidance from Health Affairs Committee and other relevant ACC stakeholder groups
- Interface with medical societies and other external allies to advance shared priorities



Current ACC-Endorsed Federal Legislation

- Preventing Maternal Deaths Reauthorization Act (H.R. 1909)
- Connected MOM Act (S. 141)
- Rural Obstetrics Readiness Act (H.R. 1254/S. 380)



Preventing Maternal Deaths Reauthorization Act (H.R. 1909)

Goal: Strengthen and expand federal support for Maternal Mortality Review Committees (MMRCs)

 MMRCs identify maternal deaths, analyze contributing factors, and recommend policy changes

What does this bill do?

Enhances MMRC funding and reach



Connected MOM Act (S. 141)

Goal: Improve access to remote monitoring for pregnant and postpartum women

 Remote monitoring tools (e.g., for blood pressure, glucose, pulse) can detect early complications.

What does this bill do?

- Directs CMS to issue coverage guidance for these tools.
- Requires updates to state Medicaid telehealth toolkits.



Rural Obstetrics Readiness Act (S. 380/H.R. 1254)

Goal: Strengthen emergency obstetric care capacity in rural hospitals

• Over half of U.S. counties are maternity care deserts

What does this bill do?

- Enhances rural hospital readiness through training for obstetric emergencies
- Provides grants for equipment
- Creates teleconsultation pilot programs
- Directs HHS to study regional care coordination models



State Affairs Key Activities

- Work with all 50 ACC State Chapters + DC to position ACC members as the voice of the cardiovascular community within State Legislatures, Agencies and Stakeholder Groups
- Advise ACC State Chapters in setting policy priorities and participating in the state legislative and regulatory processes



Current Key State Issues

- Medicaid Coverage Postpartum
 - **Goal:** Get states to expand Medicaid coverage postpartum to 1 year. All states, but two (AR & WI), have done this
- SMBP Coverage
 - **Goal:** Require Medicaid and private insurance coverage of self-measured blood pressure (SMBP) cuffs, home monitors, training, data transmission, and co-interventions
- MMRC Representation
 - **Goal:** Get a cardiologist on every Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC)




