

Value of a Subspecialty Journal

- Provides an attractive venue to publish in a high impact publication
- Stimulates clinical research
- Focuses interest in a defined subspecialty
- Becomes the go-to journal for practitioners in the field



Selecting a Team

Associate Editors – A balance of highly recognized experts who are willing to commit to dedicated evaluation of submissions, supporting and guiding the editorial team to understand the priority level of papers suitable for an evolving journal



Maintaining an associate editorial team that can enlist expert reviews

Reviewers who are dedicated to providing scholarly analysis of papers is critical for the journal to be highly respected by authors.



Showing respect to other journals

Many of the submissions to our journal will be published in other journals and sometimes will be highly cited. We will also publish articles previously rejected by others. A collaborative spirit is more helpful than a competitive one.


